STATEMENT FOR CHILD WELFARE AGENCY

My Rights:

- I have a right to know why my child is being apprehended, and an opportunity to respond after having spoken to a lawyer.
- I have a right to know a child care worker's name.
- I have a right to know a police officer's name and badge number (if applicable).
- I have a right to request for my child to be placed with a member of his/her extended family or a member of his/her Band/community or with another Native family.
- The society has a statutory duty to try to provide services to assist my family before my child is removed from my home.
- I have a right to legal advice before signing any agreement.
- I have a right to legal counsel (Legal aid may be available).
 I have a right to an alternative dispute resolution process.
- I have a right to an atternative dispute resolution process.
 I have a right to regular communication with the child care worker. My
- telephone calls should be returned within 24 hours.
- I have a right to be provided a copy of any documents.
- I have a right to make a complaint through the internal complaints process.
- I can report a child care worker who abuses me, swears at me or violates my rights.
